All over October, tourist tours and holidays happened under normal conditions, with no incidents being reported. Visitors were able to pursue discovering Madagascar's landscapes, biodiversity, and cultural richness in complete safety.

The whole sphere of tourism in Madagascar—tour operators, guides, hospitality sector, travel agencies, and transport companies—remains fully mobilized to ensure the continuity and quality of services, showing professionalism and flexibility in managing unforeseen events.

Air and sea transport operational

All airlines operating to and from Madagascar continue their international, regional, and domestic routes.
